

ECO-Vrindaban Board Meeting Minutes 10/25/2020

1. Ranaka's Monthly Report

Ranaka reported on the previous month's projects:

- Lalita Gopi (Temple Barn)
 - There are six cows giving milk: Sita, Sriya, Lalita, Usha, Gopi Katyayani, and Vamsika. Jaya Radhe is dried off and waiting to go to the Valley Barn for breeding with Dharma.
 - There are three calves at the barn: Vaisnavi, Bhisma, and Radhika Keshavi.
 - The cows are producing 20 gal of milk per day.
 - Anandavidya is making 20-30 lb of butter per week.
 - Gopi Katyayani had a bad fall and smashed her horn. Dr. Mores cleaned it up and applied a topical medicine.
 - The new hay feeder seems to have caused some minor injuries to the cows. It is being removed and replaced with a plastic-based feeder.
 - Harley, Nikita, Jacob, Sri Badarayani, Bhakta Sean, and Gopika have been helping out.

 - successfully grew an outdoor marigold garden and planted watermelon, butternut squash and kabocha squash on the sides without the animals bothering it.
 - Cleaned up the parameter of the outside of the building near high tunnels
 - Beds are currently being prepped for the last planting of this season.
 - The Farmers market wrapped up this month. Plans are in the works for expansion next year.
 - Analaksita had a meeting with Kacey Gantzner who previously worked for ECO-V regarding joining the WV Farmers Market Association and grant eligibility for \$3,500 to assist us in advertising and set-up.

- ECO-V will receive a check for \$1,991.20 to cover half of the expense of the lime that was spread on the Valley Barns fields last month.
- Surabhi, a Red Ayrshire retired milk cow, died on 10/17/20. She was residing at Bahulaban when she passed. She is estimated to have been approximately 16 years old. With her death, the herd count is 66.
