

ECO-Vrindaban Board Meeting Minutes 4/30/2023

1. Ranaka's Report for March 2023

Ranaka reported on the previous month's projects:

- Lalita Gopi (Temple Barn)
 - o Temple Barn
 - There are seven cows being milk: Lalita, Subhadra, Jayasri, Usha, Parijata, Radhika Keshavi, and Yashoda.
 - There are five calves: Padmagandha, Raghunath, Rupa, Makara, and Kadamba Kanana.
 - Butter production is back to normal: 20-30 lb per week.
 - The cows produce 28 gallons of milk per day.
 - There was a nice visit with a group of college students from Vedic Studies in Chicago. They were fun and helped with some difficult work.
 - Rasalila milks a cow almost every evening.
 - Sri Badarayani milks most Wednesday mornings.
 - Yashoda delivered her baby bull, Kadamba Kanana on March 11.
 - The barn door above the entrance doors (second floor), had blown halfway off in a windstorm. John has repaired it.
- Hari Nama (Vidya's Garden & High Tunnel)
 - Ground maintenance, moved all the cut and dried bamboo.

- Weeded the high tunnel.
- Weeded the asparagus bed.
- Weeded lily bed.
- Secured garden structures.
- Divided tuberoses and replanted them in new rows in the high tunnel.
- Cleaned and pruned carnations in the high tunnel.
- Josh Starkey (Nandagram)
 - Purchased and picked up a hay ring for the oxen.
 - Shut off the water pump (definitely have a leak in line or tank).
 - Put up the rest of the fence to separate the bull pen from Rico.
 - Let the cows out on pasture.
 - Moved 28 bales this month into a bigger barn.
 - Cleaned up more trash/rotten wood from the old cabin area.
 - Removed treated 2x6s from beside the old cabin and used them on the feed aisle in the big barn.
 - A steer got out (broke through the feed aisle). Caught him and got him back to the main herd.
 - Opened a section of fence going to the main barn, so the cows could avoid the mud when entering.
 - Walked the fence line around Snyder's and picked up branches on the fence.
 - Put 4x8 pieces of wood on the little bridge by the stream.
 - Cut a trail through the multiflora rose bushes by the stream.
 - Finished up the ATV wagon trailer.
 - Cleaned up dead trees in the small orchard.
- Ray
- Delivered hay to Temple Barn, fed and cleaned Valley Barns as needed.
- Repaired side openers on Vidya's High Tunnel and delivered a load of gravel for the driveway.
- Spread manure on the potato bottom and outside garden beside Valley High Tunnels.
- Picked up and cut 1,000 lb of potato seed.
- Did repair work on Gopal's Garden school building.
- Yudhisthira das (The New Yamuna Valley Farms) Ox Training Report
 - Completed second level of ox barn. (Ox downstairs with room for 12 round bales upstairs along with grain storage).
 - Building supplied with gravity fed spring water.
 - Continued routine training operations on a daily basis.
 - Oxen wintered well and are in very good condition, brushed daily.
- Badarayani Ox Program

- Hitched Govardhan to the cart and covered more distance (Going to Nandagram workshop shed and back to barn). Doing this almost every day.
- Trained Nandalal and Kaustubh yoking together.
- Trained Nrsimha with basic commands.
- Building a relationship with Raghunath and trained him with basic commands.
- Getting to know Kadamba.
- Suchandra (Valley High Tunnels One and Two plus Greenhouse & Outside Garden)
 - o Crew: Lila & Bhumika
 - o High Tunnel 1
 - Cleared spinach rows out.
 - Sprayed neem oil on plants and beds to try to get rid of aphids.
 - Planted Dahlias in row.
 - Made cages for dahlias.
 - Cleared beds as much as we could for tomato plants.
 - Bhumika planted tatsoi.
 - Transplanted Romaine lettuce, broccoli, green cabbage and collard greens.
 - Seeded carrots, beets and radish.
 - Bhumika added more drip line to each bed, making sure all beds had three lines.
 - Bhumika sprayed beds and plants with neem oil mix.
 - Pulled plants that were bolting.
 - Harvested kale, arugula, collard greens, rainbow chard, and Bok Choy.
 - Bhumika harvested for the devotees.
 - Weeded and watered when needed.
 - Covered and uncovered plants when temperature dropped below 27 degrees at night.
 - o High Tunnel 2
 - Thinned spinach and cilantro.
 - Seeded carrots, radish, beets, lettuce, and kale.
 - Lila dug up asparagus to replant outside.
 - Planned where to move the fig tree and tried digging up, might have to cut up to remove.
 - Cleared beds for tomatoes.
 - Added extra fencing pieces for peas to vine up.
 - Trained pea plants to vine up cages and pieces of fencing.
 - Fixed leaks in the watering system.
 - Bhumika sprayed beds and plants with neem oil mix.
 - Lila added ladybugs from her house to tunnels.

- Harvested carrots, radish, spinach, parsnip, cilantro, and some beets.
- Weeded and watered as needed.
- Covered and uncovered plants when temperature dropped below 27 degrees at night.

o Greenhouse

- Bhumika and Lila transplanted kale, broccoli, cauliflower, brussel sprouts, and other vegetables.
- Bought and mixed-up soil for soil blocker.
- Used soil blocker to make trays for marigolds and started some seeds.
- Used soil blocks for some arugula and lettuce.
- Started more vegetable seeds and zinnias.
- Moved plants from heating mats to tables.

Outside Garden

- Lila added dirt around the outside of the greenhouse and the high tunnels.
- Lila secured plastic around the high tunnels.
- Lila watered and looked after potted carnations.
- Had cow manure added to the outside bed area.
- Lila went through the outdoor bed area and removed large rocks and weeded some.
- Planted gladiolus in pots.
- Stored the rest of gladiolas in the HT building area.
- Lila made signs for the outdoor area.

Teaching Garden

- Weeded around beds and teepee.
- Cleared herb bed.
- Added manure to some of the back beds.
- Got some vines to add to the pavilion in the center of the garden.
- Cleaned out pots.
- Prepped beds for mulch.
- Planted gladiolus bulbs from the thinned out batch into beds that needed to be filled in more.
- Thinned out mint bed.

2. External Funding Request: \$7.6K for ISKCON Ministry for Cow Protection and Agriculture

WHEREAS: The ECO-V Board wishes to support cow protection and sustainable agriculture throughout ISKCON.

RESOLVED: The Board approves a grant up to \$7,600 to the North American IMCPA for its expenses for 2023. This grant is contingent upon the NA IMCPA's 501(c)(3) status being current and in good standing, as well as a full financial report from the Ministry's nonprofit.

3. External Funding Request: up to \$45K for the Village Association and Devotee Care Department

WHEREAS: The ECO-V Board wishes to help support devotees in the New Vrindaban community.

RESOLVED: The Board authorizes up to \$45K in grant funding to the New Vrindaban Village Association for the devotee care department, with the following stipulations:

- Funds will be distributed on a biannual basis
- The Village Council will continue to provide quarterly reports and financial accounting
- ECO-V maintains the option to have any unused funds returned at the end of the year
- The NVVA must bring its 501(c)3 up to good standing with the IRS (and provide proof of such to ECO-V) by filing for both the 2021 and 2022 years by July 2023. Failure to do so will delay payment for the second half of the year.
- A maximum of \$2,500 of this funding may be allocated to the NVVA. The \$42.5K is exclusively for the devotee care department.
- A 2023 financial review must be performed by an outside company such as Rama Associates.
